- 10) Which attitudes of the heart (bitterness, wrath, anger, clamor, slander, malice, etc.) do you struggle with?
- 11) How can we grow in our Christlike tender-heartedness towards one another?
- 12) How can we encourage one another to "walk in the way of love" today?
- 13) How can we pray for you this week?
