READ Acts 9:1-31.

- Describe Saul's attitude toward Christianity. What factors may have influenced that attitude?
- 2) What is the first question Jesus asked Saul?
- 3) How was Saul persecuting Jesus?
- 4) What was Paul's initial response to this encounter?
- 5) At verse 10, the focus shifts to Ananias. How does he feel about what God wants him to do?
- 6) How would you feel if God wanted you to meet someone like Saul? Would you do it?
- 7) What would be the impact if the most outspoken critic of Christianity you know came to faith?
- 8) What role did Ananias have in Saul's story?
- 9) What qualities did Saul have that made him a good candidate for taking the gospel to the Gentiles?
- 10) What is the significance of the way Ananias addressed Saul in verse 17?
- 11) In verse 16, God says, "I will show him how much he must suffer for my name." Why do think God says this?
- 12) Why does preaching the gospel go hand-in-hand with suffering? Read Acts 9:20-31.
- 13) Everyone's testimony and God-given purpose is different but special, even if it's not a radical conversion or missionary call. Share what you believe God is calling you to do/be at this point in your life.
