- 4. Genuinely repenting "I won't do it again."
- 5. Requesting forgiveness "Will you please forgive me?" Which is your default and which do you struggle to communicate?

- 11. Does Jonah repent of his hatred for the Ninevites or his rebellion?
- 12. What can you learn from Jonah's experience?
- 13. What is revealed about God and his mercy in this chapter?
- 14. How will you apply this to your life?
